In 2020, Matt LoPiccolo was named to the newly created position of senior vice president, enterprise program office (EPO). The EPO coordinates the organization's strategic and annual planning to ensure that Swagelok resources are prioritized and aligned. In addition, Matt and his team are responsible for designing and implementing a flexible set of methods, tools, and training in the areas of project, change, process, and data management that help build the capabilities required to achieve company strategies. The EPO is also responsible for facilities and construction management throughout the organization.
