1. Purpose of the Due Diligence Assessment

The purpose is to identify, prevent, mitigate, and account for how we handle actual and potential negative impacts of our own operations, supply chain, and customers related to:

- Respecting human rights
- Upholding workers' rights
- Avoiding corruption and bribery
- Preserving the environment

2. Implementation/Guiding Documents

We follow the Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) guidelines for responsible business conduct, along with OECD's guidance on due diligence. Other references we adhere to include:

- United Nations Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights (UNGP)
- UN's 10 Principles for Responsible Business
- UN Sustainable Development Goals

3. SVAFAS Stavanger Valve & Fitting AS

Swagelok Norway (SVAFAS Stavanger Valve & Fitting AS) has been an authorized Swagelok sales and service center since 1975. We supply a variety of industries with the fluid system products, services, and support needed to maintain reliable operations. Customers become more and more effective and efficient thanks to a broad range of high-quality components as well as services such as training, design and assembly, system analyses and other onsite services, complete subsystems, and e-commerce, among others. Our headquarters is in Stavanger, and we have a sales office in Porsgrunn. There are currently 31 people working in both locations.

Swagelok Norway acknowledges and works to uphold human rights, workers' rights, and the environment. We follow the UN's principles for responsible business, the UN Global Compact, which is based on ten principles covering human rights, labor standards, the environment, and anti-corruption. These principles are incorporated into our Code of Conduct, Labor and Human Rights Policy, Health and Safety policy and our Supplier Code of Ethics. Our customers and suppliers are expected to work according to these principles. We are certified by BSI for ISO 9001:2015 and ISO 14001:2015 and are currently implementing ISO 45001:2018 with a planned certification by the end of Q2 2025.



4. Supply Chain


As a distributor, we are part of a well-managed supply chain. Our largest supplier operates from the USA, and the system for deliveries has been incorporated based on experience gained over many years. We use other suppliers on a smaller scale from different countries. Our suppliers are in USA, Norway, Sweden, the Netherlands, Czech Republic, and Germany. All our suppliers have a system in place to operate in accordance with UN principles for responsible business.

The suppliers we have chosen for the due diligence assessment are based on the following criteria.

- · Suppliers of goods
- Suppliers of services

Goods are mainly procured from our main supplier and sub suppliers (that produce parts that are labeled and approved by the main supplier). This category makes up 82% of our total purchases in 2023, where the main supplier alone makes up 70% of the total procurement for the year 2023.

The suppliers of services that are included are the top 5 suppliers based on size and amount. This makes up 4% of the total procurement made in 2023.






5. Customers

ITUC GRI – Home (globalrightsindex.org)	Each year we rate countries depending on their compliance with collective labor rights and document violations by governments and employers of internationally recognized rights
world title (walkfree.org)	The index provides a country-by-country ranking of the number of people in modern slavery, as well as an analysis of the action's governments are taking to respond, and the factors that make people vulnerable.
Korrupsjon (fn.no)	The index shows the degree of corruption in the country as perceived by businesspeople, academics, and risk analysts.

We do engage business in a sector that contributes to CO2 emissions that has a negative impact on the environment. There is still a need for this type of energy, and if this is relevant, we will contribute to this market. The products we provide to the market are long-lasting and sustainable. The use of our products and services contributes to a safer workplace, less emissions, less maintenance, fever repairs and replacements. Swagelok has a lifetime warranty on the products.

We have an increased focus on the clean energy market, and we will continue to focus on this for the future. We are growing in this market, so this is a continued goal for us.



8. Actions

We are currently implementing ISO 45001, with planned audit Q2 2025. This certification, as well as ISO 14001, is part of our strategy to become a business that handles sustainability seriously and systematically. We are positive that these standards will help us reach our goals.

We are in continuous dialog with our suppliers regarding sustainability and want to increase the focus on the topic. We are part of a sustainability group among other Swagelok distributorships located in Europe. This helps us stay updated on the topic and gives us the opportunity to make an impact in our supply chain.

We will continue to require our suppliers to confirm their adherence to the UN's principles for responsible business, and we expect our customers to do the same. We will continue to do business with local suppliers to support our community.
